I'll admit, it took a while to get used to the jumping storyline however it soon became apparent there was coordination and purpose behind the sometimes rapidly jumping time line. So, looking for your new adventure with Jedi, Sith, clones, stormtroopers, smugglers and intrigue, double crossing and as story from a galaxy far, far away? "Purge" and "Dark Times Volume 1" are essential for a nice understanding of the overall story. The characters are likable and compelling making you want to read the next story right after you finish the previous one. If you're a fan of the Jedi Purge (story wise cause who's a fan of all the Jedi dying!) and Vader's quest to eliminate them read Dark Times! However these stories do not center around Vader as I first expected so don't expect him to be a major character just someone who the main characters fear.

The last few Jedi scatter across the galaxy as the power of the Emperor and Darth Vader grows. Jedi Dass Jennir, ostracized from his only friends, takes a job that changes his destiny forever. Pitting two gangs against one another, Jennir attracts the attention of a bounty hunter, his former allies on the smuggling ship Uhumele and Lord Vader himself! Meanwhile, Jedi Master K'Kruhk tries to shield a group of Padawans from Vader's obsessive hunt for Jedi. Culminating in a confrontation between the Jedi and Darth Vader, the galaxy's dark times continue...
