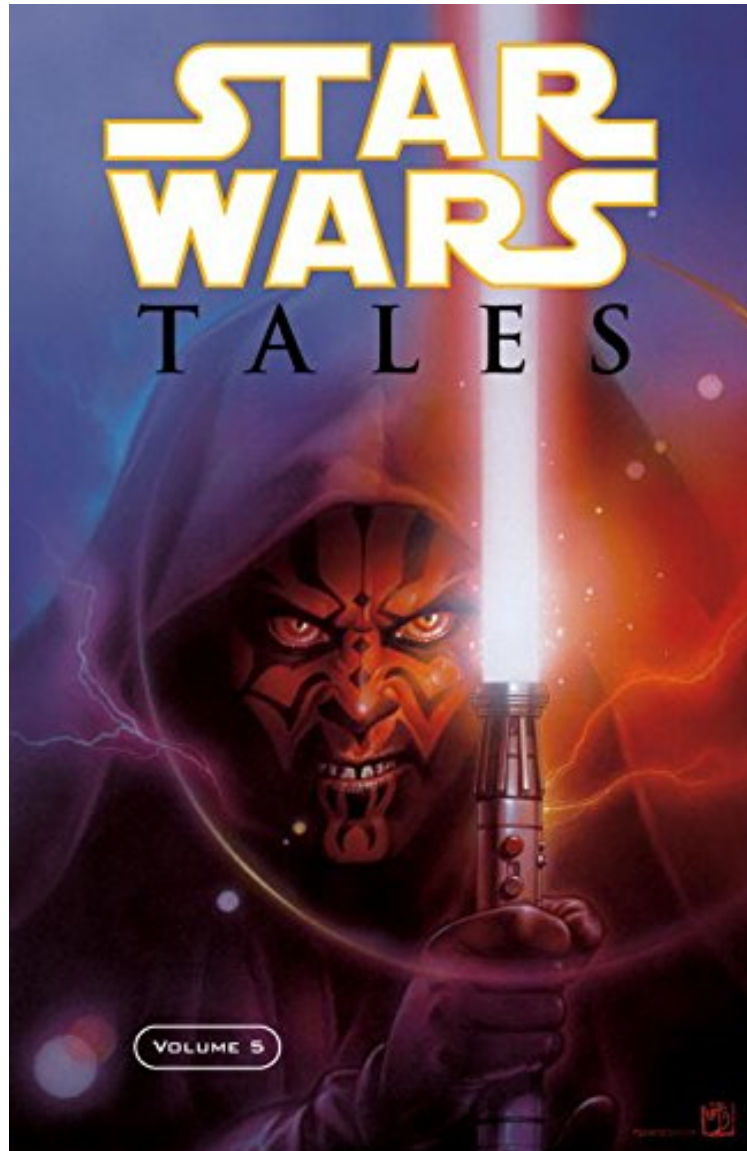

Boba Fett gets the spotlight in several stories. Some of my favorite stories do not fall into the "real" Star Wars universe. I found the parody of the Breakfast Club to be fairly funny. I also enjoyed the story of Han and Chewie making an impact on Earth (loved the cameo in that one). But overall, I can't say that most of the stories blew me away. They weren't bad, just not that memorable to me. I also didn't like a lot of the artwork which detracted from the story. The weakest of the Star Wars: Tales Omnibus series, but still contains some gems. By customer. Of the five Star Wars: Tales omnibus books, this is by far the weakest entry. Many of the stories - particularly those in the last half of the book - are written and drawn by creators who appear to have been trained in the alternative press rather than mainstream comics. As a result, the art and storytelling is substandard when compared to that omnibus volumes 1-4. Characterizations wander far afield from the characters we know and the character likenesses are poor to nonexistent. Having said that, there are some gems in this collection. A particularly clever story involves Han Solo and Chewbacca lost in space. Further description would inevitably lead to the disclosure of major plot points, so that vague description will have to suffice. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
