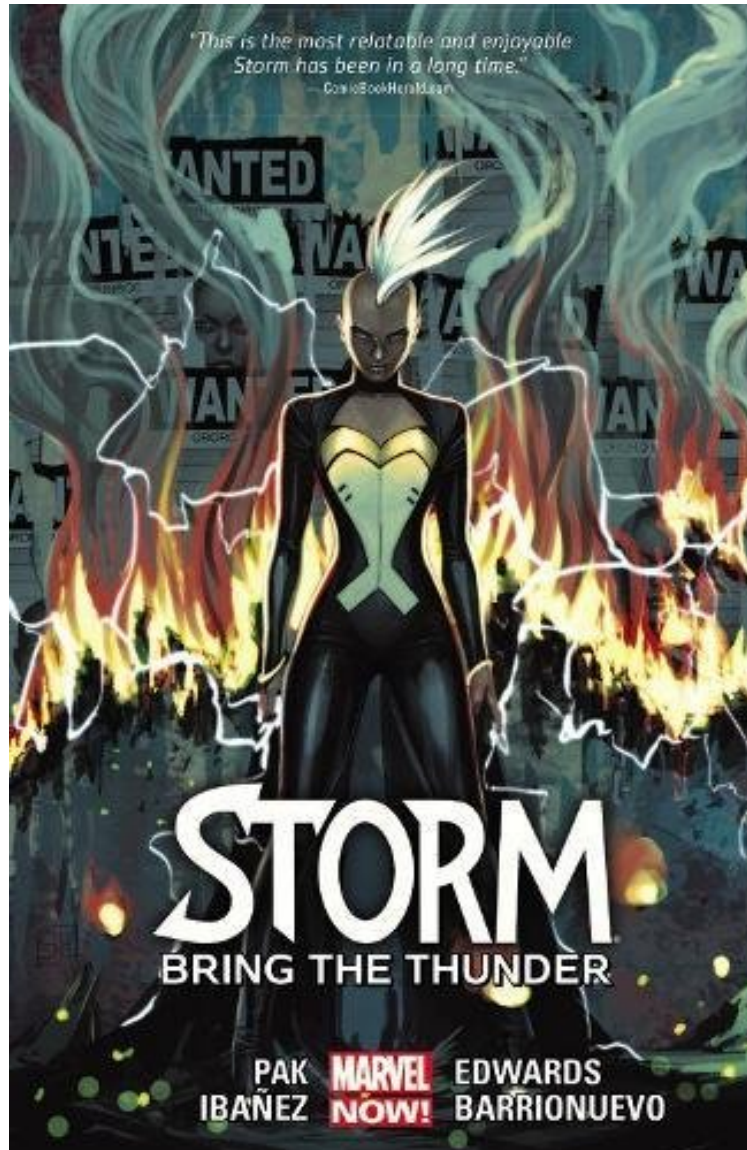

There is some intrigue and some spy stuff and some good fight scenes.
