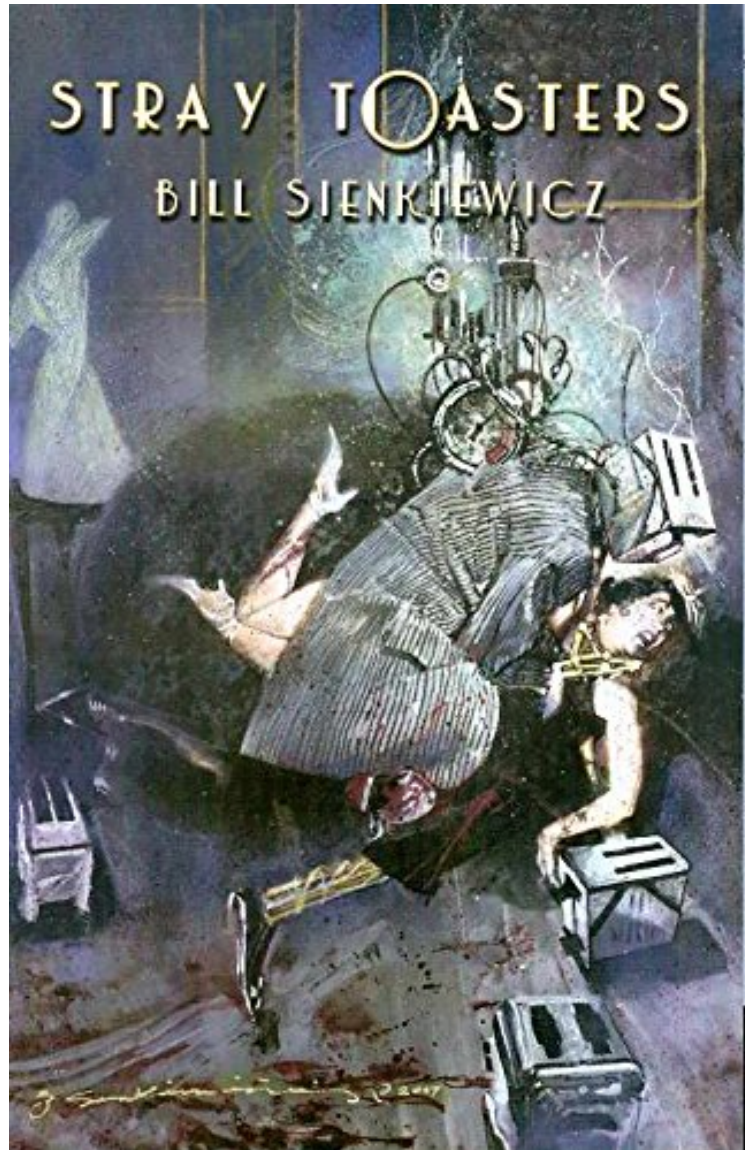

But there's a touch of detective novel as well (like in Bladerunner - he's chasing some crazy machines).The print is nice, paper is OK, and at the end of the book you have a few sketches illustrations by Mr. Sienkiewicz, as some bonus material.There is only one thing that could get on your nerves: Too much captions (txt boxes).
