This is a continuing storyline that also includes Super Street Fighter: New Generation and Super Street Fighter: Hyper Fighting with those two books being frequently referenced. To those who are unaware, the events of SF III chronologically come last in the video game series falling after SF V. My biggest issue with the SF III comics thus far has been the lack of SF III characters. The three SF III games were unique in the series in that they ditched almost all the established characters and created a

nearly entirely new roster. The comics, however, have relied on the more well known fighters but Im very happy to see that Udon is finally putting the focus on the SF III stars. Volume two introduces Oro, Dudley, Elena, Hugo, Sean, Makoto, Yun and Yang. Necro and Ibuki appeared in the previous volume but now are integrated into the actual storyline. The only characters that have yet to put in any appearance are Remy and Q. It will be interesting to see if they make it into the next and final volume. As I expected Oro gets the most time as he takes Ryu on as his pupil. Oro is apparently the most powerful fighter in the series and literally fights with one arm bound to reduce his advantage. Besides filling out most of the SF III roster, volume two also gets to the meat of the story with the inevitable tournament. We get some decent fights including Ryu vs DeeJay and Adon vs Rufus. Hugo vs Alex was a much more interesting fight and although it wasnt in the official tournament there is a very compelling fight between Sagat and Dan. Although Dan was created as a joke character his father was killed in a fight by Sagat so theres no joke here. My only issue at this point is that Gill is just not nearly as compelling a villain as M. Bison. Also, the reason for the tournament is pretty much exactly the same as Bisons. There is the theory that if it aint broken dont fix it but there does seem to be a bit of a lack of creativity on Capcoms part (I cant blame Udon for this one). The art in this volume is excellent and I absolutely loved the Homage covers in the back of the book as well as the artwork. This is my favorite volume thus far in the SF III series and I hope the next volume will bring the series to a satisfying conclusion. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Great book!
