A straightforward but solid story By Charlie Griffin Katana is one of my favorite lesser-knowns in the Super Hero realm, but she has never truly gotten a chance to shine on her own. This book is a miniseries that was originally published alongside of Deadshot's "Suicide Squad: Most Wanted" miniseries, but separating the two as collections is, almost paradoxically, the best move that could have been made for Katana.

Compared to Deadshot's companion story, Katana's is far more straightforward. Once you move this collection out of immediate comparison to the other, though, it's easier to appreciate the solid and fun romp Katana takes against a classic DC villain cult. I was really hoping this book would be an exception for me because I really enjoyed Suicide Squad, but I just did not really enjoy this graphic novel. The illustrations were good, I guess. Because of my lack of experience with graphic novels, I don't have much to compare them to however. I didn't find myself having issues following the illustration panes, so that's a positive for me. Being able to follow the storyline was definitely a bonus, but it didn't help much. As far as the story goes, I just felt like it was somewhat lacking in the delivery. I never really felt very engaged with the characters, and during the high action scenes, there were so many sentence fragments I wanted to bang my head against my desk. I get that I'm probably supposed to get the story from the pictures at that point, but I just don't enjoy doing that. I'm not a child anymore and prefer to form my own pictures in my head while reading because my brain is capable of doing that.
