After over 4 years of writing the Suicide Squad, he still had not lost his touch! These stories are intriguing, surprising, and -- at times -- funny. The artwork is serviceable, but not stunning. Normally, this would doom a comic book, rather like a movie you can hear but can't see well. In this case, the story and dialogue are so strong, serviceable artwork is enough.
