While Snyder's saga is a story about acceptance and responsibility, the underlying romance between Alec and Abby really sets the narrative in motion. The theme of sacrifice is most prevalent in Snyder's final volume and it resonates with the reader long after the final page has been turned. The artwork is beautiful - especially the contributions of Yannick Paquette - and of course, the writing is impeccable. To those who have asked me what new superhero/story-line to recommend, I never hesitate in endorsing Snyder's revival of the underrated and surprisingly very sympathetic, Swamp Thing.
