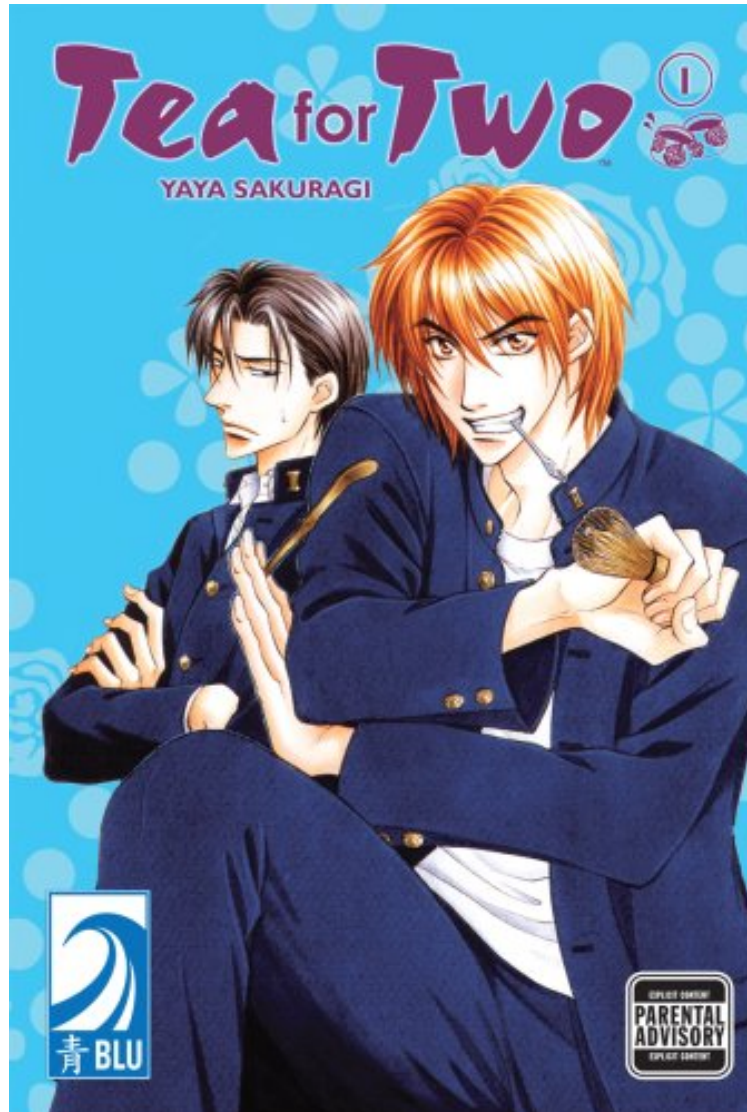

family. The story is basically about the relationship that develops between them as they find themselves more and more drawn to each other. This manga has plenty of comic moments and is a pretty light, entertaining read. Although it's not really plot driven, the story is involving and reads very well. The characters are likeable and well developed. (I especially like that both Tokumaru and Hasune are equally enthusiastic and assertive in their relationship.) The artwork is also nice, although not typically beautiful- Yaya Sakuragi definitely has her own distinct style.
