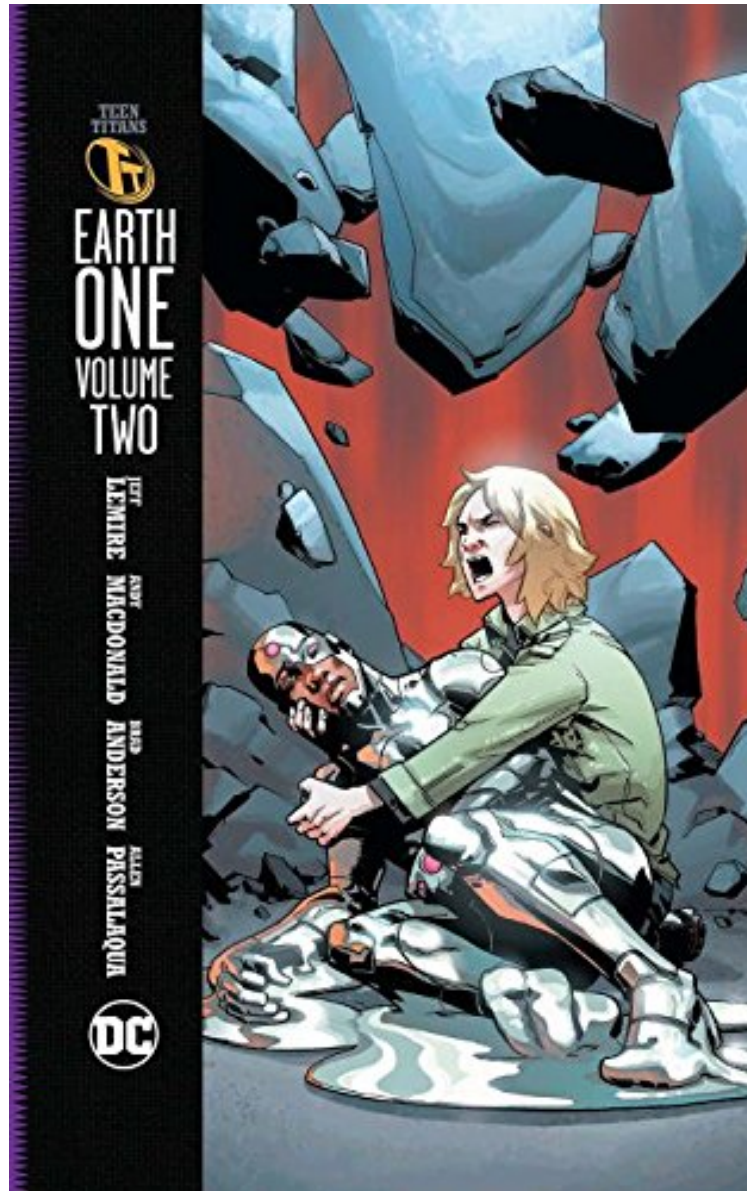

I have just finished reading Teen Titans Earth One, and WOW I was blown away. The story came up to the level that I have come to expect in the Earth One Universe. After reading the Earth One Batman, and Wonder

Woman, I have come to expect a high level of storytelling in these DC line. The art was good, but I think they were trying a bit too hard to give a nod to the different Teen Titans Animated series that have been on the air over the few decades. It was not bad art, but I lacked the crisp clean look that Batman, and Wonder Woman had. I love the fact that TT is getting an A level story line. Since 1965 when the Teen Titans first got its own title, it has been relegated to B and C level stories, and was pretty much a dumping ground for sidekicks that has gotten too old to be sidekicks any more. In the 1980s and 1990s there were a few good TT stories, but they were overshadowed by works like The Dark Knight Returns, and the Killing Joke to name a few. One of the things I think DC did right; was the way Garfield Mark "Gar" Logan's parents were handled. DC had decided that in the Earth One universe that his parents are a homosexual couple. It is presented as if it was not a big deal. You were not hit over the head time and time again, with the SJW identity politics club, while at the same time DC admitting that there are homosexuals, that are in the world with productive lives, and adopting children. It was well played on DC's part. I do admit that the only reason I picked up this title was to have built a complete Earth One library. After reading it I am glad I did pick it up and look forward to getting the next Earth One Teen Titans.

I don't have any particular interest in "teen superheroes" based on what I've generally seen of the Teen Titans, Young Justice, etc. It just doesn't appeal to me. However, the lovely cover art prominently featuring Raven caught my eye, I clicked, and I bought. No regrets; I feel lucky to have come across this collection.

Long story short, this is a very nice graphic novel. First, the internal artwork is high-quality. I can't tell you how many times I've picked up a comic or trade paperback, interested in the characters, only to be put off by lousy art. This is very stylized, but sharp, attractive. I love the revised character designs. And the story is cool. This is just the beginning, but I like the way that it is paced and how Starfire's presence is felt throughout. All in all, a very enjoyable volume that has artistic merit, promising world-building and doesn't pander to younger readers. Good stuff.
