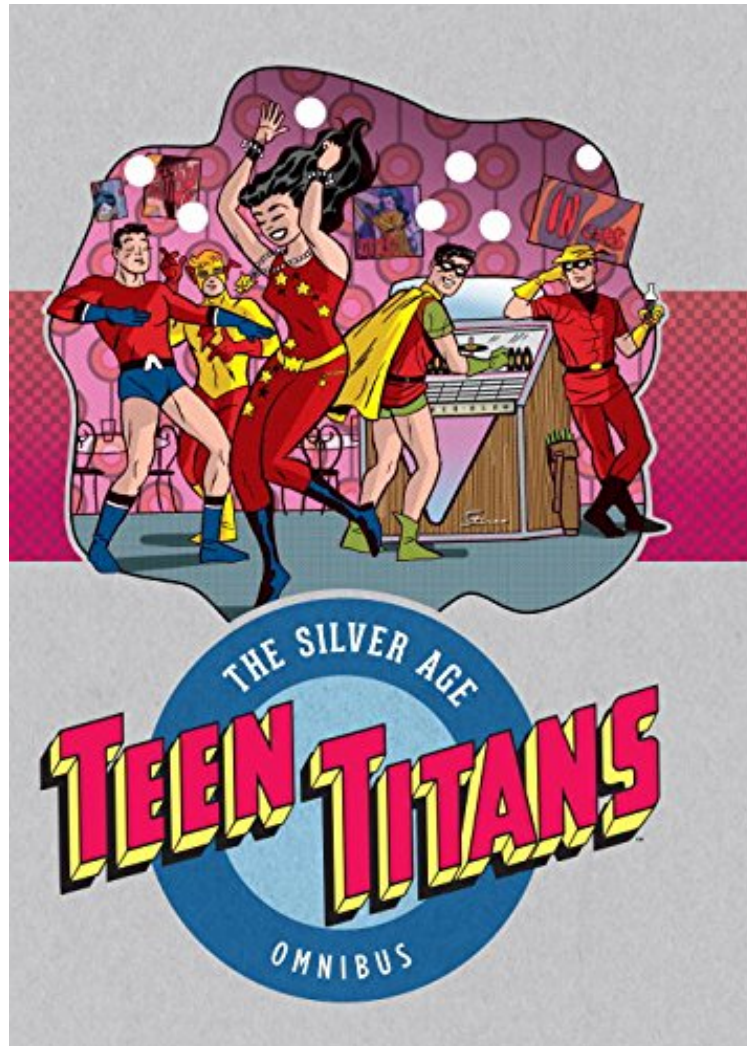

Brave and The Bold and Showcase as well as Teen Titans numbers 1 through 24. An unexpected bonus was the inclusion of the Hawk the Dove comics as well, even though Hawk Dove were not Teen Titans during this period, I guess DC wanted to fill out a "Silver Age" omnibus with comics from the 1960's rather than cross into the 1970's, which DC considers to be the start of the "Bronze Age" of comics. If this collection sells well, I would expect them to come out with a "Bronze Age" Teen Titans omnibus with the 1970's issues. This collection is a treasure. It covers the early formation of the Teen Titans and goes through the joining of Speedy and Wonder Girl's new uniform, as well as guest appearances by Beast Boy and Hawk Dove. Some of the stories are timepieces from the "mod" 1960's, as DC used the series to try to tap into the youth culture at the time and be "hip"; their battle with the villain Mad Mod being a prime example of this. Steve Ditko's Hawk and Dove are similar timepieces of the period, as comic's metaphor of the cultural divide between the "hawks" and the "doves" in society and politics. Haney is perhaps best known for his role in the creation of Metamorpho, Eclipso and the Teen Titans, his long runs on Batman and Robin, Suicide Squad, Tomahawk and Mystery in Space, and his contributions to DC's line of war comics.
