Great Volume (Aside from One Lackluster Side Plot) That Introduces Classic Titans like Rose Wilson and Miss MartianBy clairetoldmetochangemyscreennameTitans Around the World picks up one year after the events of Infinite Crisis and the previous volume. The most important developments are those from Infinite Crisis (particularly the death of Superboy) and the events of 52: the year long

comic that fills in the gaps of what occurred during that missing year. One of the plot points of 52 was the numerous roster changes to the Teen Titans. With Wonder Girl falling in with a questionable cult and Robin traveling the globe with Batman as the latter tried to overcome the paranoia and darkness that had clouded him, the Titans' leadership mostly fell on Beast Boy. Even Raven eventually left the group. Moreover, Cyborg had returned from his adventure in space (during the Infinite Crisis prequel Rann-Thanagar War) having been seriously damaged and out of commission for some time. Volume 6 picks up a year later with Cyborg rebooting his systems and coming to finally. He discovers the team has drastically changed with many of his older teammates and friends having left and a bunch of newcomers taking their spots. Most surprising to Victor is the addition of Kid Devil (the former sidekick to Blue Devil who gained actual superpowers during the events of 52) and Ravager (Slade Wilson's daughter). Cyborg sets out to immediately start tracking down his old pals as he is distrustful of the newbies, especially Rose Wilson. Robin is meanwhile in mourning for Superboy and secretly attempting to grow a new clone of Conner. Finally, Raven returns along with Wonder Girl to reveal to the rest of the team that there was a traitor among their group during the year Cyborg was out of commission. All in all this was a great read though you will absolutely need to have read Infinite Crisis and 52 to make sense of the time skip and some of the new faces who pop up both on the team and during the investigation into the traitor. Titans Around the World does kick start the careers of many famous Titans such as Miss Martian (whose story arc will be very familiar to fans of the great Young Justice animated show). Likewise the book begins the reformation of Rose Wilson from Slade's devout slave (like she was last time we saw her) into a hero of her own. The only real downside to the book is the horrifically bad subplot about Robin's attempts to clone Conner. Although his mental state is certainly understandable, it feels off for an intelligent character like Tim Drake to not understand how fruitless it would be to create an entirely new clone of a friend who had passed. Also the scene when he and Wonder Girl share a fleeting kiss (in front of the test tubes where Robin is trying to create the clone) felt way too out of left field. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
