After the events of the previous volume (in which Ravager reformed and joined the team and Jericho managed to return to life via a cloned body) Slade puts the team in his sights and

announces his intentions to reclaim his children. To that end, Slade assembles his own counter team of the "Titans East" even going so far as to rebuild the original Titans tower on the East Coast. The book also delves into the tragic backstory of recent team addition Kid Devil, sidekick to Blue Devil, and the misguided deal he made with a literal demon to get actual powers. This is a fun volume, albeit a bit rushed. Some of the characters on the Titans East team don't get as much of a chance to make an impression as one would like. Batgirl (Cassandra Cain) and her reasons for joining Slade are explained away in one too brief exchange. The ending and resolution of the fight, especially Slade's motivations, are solid and fit with his overarching portrayal as a man who has no real idea how to take care of his children or relate to them. The biggest flop of the story is the final issue that sees the Titans (both old and new) investigating the murder of Duela Dent. The story is barely related to the main plot and ends without any clear answers provided. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. It is full with action but there was so much of it that at one point I thought everything was pointless... Until the last page for Titans East where Deathstroke tells us why he did what he did. I didn't expect that revelation, honestly. That made it all cool. After that there was the "Whom killed Duela Dent" story. Short and somewhat pointless because it's tied up with Countdown and really didn't have much to do here. The art of the book is ok. Not great but ok. I liked it, but there's several artists so it's a bit of inconstant. The first chapter was very poorly illustrated but some of the other chapters looked great. My biggest turn off of the whole run was the over use of splash pages to chew up page count. For a couple of the chapters there is a splash page every 4th page for no real reason. I'll let some of the plot issues slide because I haven't picked up a Titans book in over a year so I might just be out of the loop but the read was very choppy at some points.
