The sheer grit and depth of story is amazing to behold. My only issue is the HUGE gap between volumes 3 and 4. I wasn't sure at first, but I noticed that 27 comics are not covered between the two books. There may be a reason behind this jump that the authors intended, but I'm almost disappointed to be skipping that much story in between. Either way, I still love them and look forward to reading the others.

Volume 4 of the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles Ultimate Collection brings the start of a major Turtles storyline: "City at War!" Starting with the two-part "Shades of Gray," get ready as Eastman and Laird strap themselves down and get back to making those TMNTs as the multi-part "City at War" explodes onto the comics page!

About the Author Kevin Eastman- Born in 1962 in Portland, Maine, Kevin began drawing as soon as he was able to hold a crayon. His discovery of comic books gave meaning to his crazed doodling. When Kevin discovered and studied the work of Jack Kirby, Russ Heath, Richard Corben, Vaughn Bode and John Severin, he began to hone his craft. His first published work appeared in 1980, a year or so before he met Peter Laird. In May 1984, he and Laird published Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles #1, creating the hit heroes in a half-shell. Eastman co-writes Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles for IDW and can sometimes be found at the San Diego Comic Art Gallery. Peter Laird is an American comic book writer and artist. He is best known for co-creating the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles with writer and artist Kevin Eastman.
